## **Year 4 Workshop**

Year 4 were visited by the School of Noise last week as part of our Science topic on Sound. The children learnt about how sound is made, combined with hands-on object-based play and experimentation. We carried out scientific experiments on how sound is made, how it travels and where it ends up. The children had lots of fun exploring a range of equipment, including a theremin, tuning forks, Chladni plates (making patterns in sand using vibration), and real fruit and vegetables that can trigger musical sounds and more. We ended the workshop by creating everyday sound effects to be added to a film which was fascinating!

On Sunday, 26th January three Biggin Hill Primary Students took part in a major Karate tournament. The Liverpool Open Championships is a National WUKF sanctioned Karate Championship, where competitors from all over the UK and even Europe, compete in Kata and Kumite (Fighting). Jessica G, Ella G and Woody N all took part in this national event. All three did well in Kata but unfortunately failed to place. Woody fought in the 6yrs and under Male Nihon section, wining a Bronze medal! Ella fought in the 7-8yrs Female Nihon section also taking home Bronze. Given their ages, these two fought really well deserving these placements. Jessica had a very large section to compete in and won 2 out of her 3 fighting matches, narrowly missing out on a medal in the individuals (10-12yr old Female). Jessica then fought in the teams section (in a team of 3) and after some very difficult rounds they won their section, taking home a Gold medal and making them WUKF Champions in the 12yrs & Under Open Grade Female Team Nihon. Special thanks to Sensi Ellie of Kaigaishii Karate (the local school club) for all her coaching; for a small club Kaigaishii is being noticed on the national scene.

# **Roll of Honour**


