Welcome back to the start of a fantastic year in Year 5! We've hit the ground running this term with an exciting range of topics and we have been incredibly impressed with how engaged and enthusiastic the classes have been. Here's a glimpse of what we've been up to so far:

In English, we've studied "The Dam." We started by creating our own dams and testing them to see if they would work. Then we moved on to process writing, persuasive texts, descriptions and creating tourist brochures.



In Maths, we have started our new mastering number arithmetic sessions and have focused on Statistics and Place Value, mastering big numbers and interpreting data.

In Spelling, we've tackled tricky words with 'ough', silent letters, and double consonants.

We have been reading "Beowulf" in Destination Reader, sharpening our skills in predicting, summarising and clarifying.

We have been busy in our topic sessions too - in Science we've explored the solar system, in Geography we have compared the USA and the UK and in RE lessons we have been highlighting how far a Sikh would go for their faith. In French we've been learning to talk about our pets!

In PE we have been playing hockey, improving our dribbling and teamwork skills, whilst in In Art, we've looked at architecture and designing buildings based on the work of architects we have studied. We have also had fun in Computing where we have been programming music with Scratch.
