<u>Year 3</u>

So far in English, Year Three have been predicting what will happen in a book called Gregory Cool. Later on in the year, the Year 3s wrote a message in a bottle to a scientist. They described what they saw in multiple images. In Science, they have been learning about magnets and how they can push and pull objects. They have learned about sedimentary rocks and igneous rocks. The Year 3s have learnt about the different layers of the earth – the crust, mantle, outer core and inner core.

These are what the two Year 3s told us. We asked what books they like to read and both said Polar Express and Escape from Pompeii. In Maths they did part whole models and said 105-5=100 and then 100-3=97. They said 50mm=5cm. They said that their teachers help them with ideas and help them read.
